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




1. On-Resistance vs. Drain Current




3. On-Resistance vs. Gate-to-Source Voltage







2. Transfer Characteristics




4. Drain-to-Source Forward Voltage










7. Gate Charge


8. Normalized On-Resistance Vs Junction Temperature






9. Safe Operating Area
